**New Hampshire Charitable Foundation Grants \$40,000**  
**to Community Child Care Center of Portsmouth**

Portsmouth, NH (June 28, 2011)- The New Hampshire Charitable Foundation has awarded Community Child Care Center of Portsmouth a two-year operating support grant totaling \$40,000 for its high quality, affordable early childhood and school-age programming. This Community Impact grant was made possible by the Piscataqua Region Community Fund. This grant will offset expenses through June 2013 for the program which serves over 300 children in five locations, with a \$1.9 million budget.

"The investment of the New Hampshire Charitable Foundation is so important to our work, as we depend on operating funds to pay our highly qualified teachers, and maintain continuity," said Michelle Flynn, President of the CCCC Board of Directors. "These dollars ensure that our teachers can continue to impact the healthy growth and development of all the children, while 250+ center parents are able to work each day."

The New Hampshire Charitable Foundation serves communities throughout New Hampshire, southeastern Maine and eastern Vermont. The Foundation manages a growing collection of charitable funds created by individuals, families and corporations. Outside of the government, the Foundation is the largest grantmaker in the state, making more than 3000 grants to nonprofits and nearly 1600 student aid awards totaling approximately \$30 million annually. The Foundation is nonpartisan, frequently playing the role of convener and catalyst on a broad spectrum of issues.
